- Conference 2018
  - 2718 registered bee keepers in W.A. of which
  - 55 with more than 200 hives
  - 102 with between 50 and 199 hives
- As at 09-5-2019 we have
  - 3167 (+449 increase) registered bee keepers in W.A. of which
  - 63 (+8) with more than 200 hives
  - 106 (+4) with between 50 and 199 hives

## The Australian Honey bee Industry Biosecurity Code of Practice

- Be Registered
- 2. <u>Must Report Notifiable Diseases</u>
- 3. Hives Must be Regularly Inspected
- 4. Must Control or Eradicate Pests and Diseases
- 5. Must Maintain Records
- 6. Hives Must Branded
- 7. Must Not Allow Hives, or Appliances to Become Exposed or Neglected
- 8. Must Allow Their Operation to Be Assessed
- 9. Must Demonstrate a Minimum Level of Knowledge Honey Tested Annually for American Foulbrood
- 10. Annually Certification of Compliance with the code
- 11. Apiary Sites Identified
- 12. Maintain a Barrier System
- 13. Beekeepers Should Maintain a Barrier System of Hive Management


#### **AFB Eradication New Zealand**

- National Pest Management Plan for American Foulbrood
- Estimated losses of 6% of gross returns -valued at \$329 million in 2017
- Achievable
  - small honey bee population (est 885,000 inc ferals)
  - Importations restrictions and boarder protecting
  - Strong governance monitoring and audit
  - Empowering bee keepers


